Roman dictator Lucio Silla has exiled the senator Cecilio and is plotting to take Cecilio's fiancée, Giunia—the daughter of Silla's fallen enemy—as his own. Meanwhile, Rome falls into chaos under Silla's oppressive rule. Cinna, a loyal ally, secretly aids Cecilio's return and together they vow to restore the crumbling republic. Cecilio is led to a temple, where he finds Giunia mourning both her father and the husband she believes is lost. Their emotional reunion reignites their hope for freedom, even as they face the looming shadow of Silla's tyranny.

Emperor Tito initially plans to marry Berenice, but in a bid to win his people's favor, decides instead to wed Servilia, the sister of his trusted friend Sesto. Unbeknownst to Tito, Servilia and Sesto's friend Annio are secretly in love and fear their union is now impossible. However, when Servilia confesses her feelings to Tito, he generously releases her from the engagement. Meanwhile, Vitellia, daughter of the deposed emperor, seethes with jealousy over not being Tito's first choice for a wife. She manipulates Sesto, who is infatuated with her, into plotting to assassinate the emperor. Upon learning that Tito may now be considering her, Vitellia tries to stop the plan, but it is too late—Sesto has already initiated the insurrection, believing he has murdered Tito after setting the Capitol ablaze.

At the dawn of the new millennium, three suburban sixth graders gather around the family computer, immersed in the coolest game of the year: Magic Flute 2000. Everything seems perfect until the trio realizes their avatar, Pamina, believes her beloved Tamino has abandoned her due to his vow of silence during his initiation trial. Devastated, she's on the verge of ending her life. Can our three heroes save her in time? Will Pamina rise from despair to become the warrior princess she's destined to be? Only time—and their gaming skills—will tell.

Their emotions intertwine as Marguerite gives way to her passion, but there's a sense of foreboding beneath their joy, hinting at the tragic consequences that will follow.

Outraged by this brutal act, Cesare refuses the gift, while Cornelia, Pompeo's widow, and her son, Sesto, swear vengeance on Tolomeo. Amidst the turmoil, Tolomeo's cunning sister, Cleopatra, hatches her own plot to seize power. Disguised as a maid, she sets out to seduce Cesare, hoping to win his favor and secure her claim to the throne.

#### OPERA AT MANHATTAN SCHOOL OF MUSIC

Manhattan School of Music opera productions have been praised as a significant contribution to operatic life in New York City, and numerous performances have been released as commercial recordings. Opera is a significant feature of the vocal performance experience at MSM. All voice students participate in ensembles, and opera experience is available through a rich variety of opera related programs and courses.

Graduate students develop their artistry under the guidance of eminent artist teachers, while gaining exposure before New York City audiences through the many performance opportunities MSM offers. Productions each year include two full operas with orchestra on the Neidorff-Karpati stage; a new fall opera scenes series; a new fall chamber opera-level production; a fall Opera Workshop to hone audition and professional skills; a new spring Opera in Concert collaboration with the MSM Symphony Orchestra; a workshop of a new work or a workshop performance of a one-act opera; and a Musical Theatre Lab.

Juniors and seniors participate in a fall opera scenes program that explores a wide variety of styles and languages while developing important artistic and collaborative skills. In the spring, they audition to appear in a fully staged production with chamber orchestra, or in a one-act opera or cabaret-style performance with piano.
