A few months ago, I lost the possibility of meeting a person because, seven days before our planned encounter, she passed away. For this reason, I began to reflect on the nature of life, trying to understand its direction, not its meaning. The focus is cyclical. What happens during life becomes our greatest passion and our worst fear. However, it becomes irrelevant beyond the memories it leaves in others.
